#### AN EASTER REFLECTION

The Easter story is pivotal to our faith. Every time we meet together to celebrate the Eucharist we make a stunning declaration (the *Mysterium fidei*) during the Great Thanksgiving prayer:

Let us proclaim the mystery of faith: Christ has died Christ is risen Christ will come again

The seasons of Lent and Easter focus our attention on the monumental events of Christ's passion, death and resurrection. In each celebration of the Eucharist we remember and celebrate these events, probing their meaning for all those who have been united with Christ through the sacrament of baptism. We claim again God's promises made to us in our own baptism and restore our vision for the kingdom of God. To commence his ministry Jesus came up from Nazareth to the Jordan to experience the baptism by water offered by John the Baptist. He is therein affirmed by God and encouraged by the Spirit and begins His inevitable journey to Calvary and the Resurrection, a journey on which we accompany Him resolutely from the beginning of Lent.

In Advent 2023 we sang in common worship a congregational hymn (TIS 282) which has a recurring line: "With power, with justice, he will walk his way." The hymn foretells the path that Christ's life of ministry will take and the deeds he will accomplish. In the inevitability of His journey towards Calvary the same line will be sung over and over. We journey through Advent anticipating the birth of the Messiah, then we journey in company with Jesus through His Nativity, His Lenten temptations and ministry, the pain of Good Friday and the joyous and baffling Easter resurrection, finally finding ourselves both able and convicted to proclaim the Mysterium fidei (the mystery of faith) as we do regularly in our Communion service.

As we move into the ministry year beyond Easter we look forward to travelling with Reverend David as he joins us in our journey of growth and the search for refreshment of our vision for sharing the Gospel within our community and beyond. May we all be careful for each other and loving in our relationships as we proclaim once more: *Christ will come again. Amen* 



#### TUMORROMA CENTENARY

A joyous centenary celebration was shared by the Parish and Bishop Mark on 16 December 2023. A report appeared in the February edition of the Diocesan paper, the *Anglican News* (available online, see p.6) complete with photos. Over 70 people from near and far gathered on the day and this number happily included Mrs Lola Moulstone (the niece of the builder of the church, Dallas Margules). Congratulations to Alison and the other parishioners who master-minded the commemoration.



#### RIVERSIDE REFLECTIONS

"Good news, every day of the year"

The apostle Peter speaks to the household of Cornelius in Caesarea:

<sup>38</sup> "God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power, [who] went around doing good and healing all who were under the power of the devil, because God was with him. <sup>39</sup> "We are witnesses of everything he did in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They killed him by hanging him on a cross, <sup>40</sup> but God raised him from the dead on the third day and caused him to be seen. <sup>41</sup> He was not seen by all the



people, but by witnesses whom God had already chosen - by us who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. <sup>42</sup> He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one whom God appointed as judge of the living and the dead. <sup>43</sup> All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name." Acts 10:38-43 (NIV)

Greetings to you all! Rachel, Phoebe and I are excited to be in your midst as part of the church in Tumut and surrounds. It is a beautiful part of the world which our good God has created, and we're keen to do some further exploration as time goes on. We also greatly appreciate the warm welcome we have received from parishioners and community members and look forward to getting to know you all better. I arrived in my previous parish shortly before Christmas; this time I have arrived just in time for Easter. As we all know, seasons like these involve a lot of commercial advertising and marketing. It seems that just as soon as one celebration is over, retailers start promoting the next one (hot cross buns have been known to make an appearance in supermarkets even just a couple of days after Christmas!).

A few years ago, I remember one particular TV ad which featured a family of chocolate Easter bunnies who were having a conversation.

The first bunny says, "Hey guys, it's Easter! It's all about us."

But a second bunny replies, "No it's not. There's a lot more to Easter...(pause)"

At this point I could hardly believe my ears. Was a commercial TV promotion about to say something about Jesus, about the Christian faith? Naïve, wishful thinking on my part! The bunny continued on, "There's a lot more to Easter: there's arts and crafts, board games, making hats..."

Part of me gets annoyed and frustrated when I think about this ad. And yet, there's an important truth to remember. While the trivial, commercialised aspects of Easter are confined to just one day or season in the calendar, the Christian faith is of far greater importance and significance. The gospel of Christ is good news for every day of the year. This message of Jesus' life, death and resurrection has ramifications for the entire universe, for every person.

Acts 10:38-43 (quoted above) provides a succinct summary of these world-changing events. Verse 39 refers to the heart of His mission, His death on the cross: a death that involved unimaginable physical, emotional and spiritual suffering. Although our Saviour had the power to escape this, He chose to endure it out of love for you and me, so that He could bear the punishment for our sins, reconcile us to God and defeat humanity's biggest problem: sin and evil.

Verse 40 then reminds us that Jesus did what no one else has ever done: He rose again. Not as a spirit, or a ghost, but in the flesh. Eyewitnesses testify to the fact that the tomb was empty, that the risen Lord appeared, even eating and drinking. His resurrection gives hope to all those who trust in Him: that we too can have eternal life and one day be raised in glorified, immortal bodies that will never die.

This risen Lord Jesus is also, as verse 42 points out, the one appointed as "judge of the living and the dead." He is the one who has our eternity in His hands, the only one with the right to judge. And although we do not live up to God's perfect and holy standards, Christians are declared "not guilty". As verse 43 says, "everyone who believes in Him (Christ) receives forgiveness of sins through His name."

So let's remember that it's not "all about us", as the bunny said. Easter and indeed life itself is all about the Lord Jesus, about what He's done for us, and about whether or not we have a relationship with Him. If we possess nothing else except faith in Him, we already have all that truly matters.

May we trust in the one who gives us good news, every day of the year and for all eternity.

God bless you and those you hold dear.

#### INDUCTION OF Rev DAVID RAJASEKARAM

n a very hot Wednesday evening, 28 February 2024, All Saints' was full to celebrate the induction of Rev David Rajasekaram as Rector of the Parish and to warmly welcome him, his wife Rachel, daughter Phoebe and several members of his family.

Our Diocesan Bishop, the Rt Rev Mark Short, welcomed all present, including Bishop Rt Rev Trevor Edwards, Archeacon Rev Grant Bell, Area Dean Rev Craig Rogers, several other clergy, local parishioners and representatives of other local denominations and adjoining parishes, Snowy Valleys Council Deputy Mayor, Mrs Trina Thomson, and Dr Joe McGirr, Independent Member for Wagga Wagga. Parishioners from Murrumburrah-Harden escorted the Rector-elect to the front of the church where the Bishop gave thanks to God for his ministry in that Parish, following which the Wardens of All Saints', on behalf of the Tumut Parish, welcomed Rev David to be our Pastor, Priest and Teacher. Members of the All Saints' congregation presented symbols of ministry to Rev David, including a Bible, a Prayer Book, Baptismal water, Bread and Wine, and a Purple stole and healing oil, with the Bishop then praying over Rev David and presenting him with his Licence as Rector of the Tumut Parish.

The service continued, concluding with a personal welcome to Rev David and his family from Dr McGirr, Cr Thomson, Pastor Eddie Olsen on behalf of other Tumut Christian denominations, and members of All Saints' Parish.


Refreshments were shared in the (air-conditioned!) Parish Hall where much fellowship was enjoyed.



#### VALE NICK BROWNING (25 October 1947 - 22 January 2024)

The death of Nick Browning on 22 January 2024 was noted with sadness but also with a great sense of thanks for a full and loving life lived in the service of God and his fellow creatures. A reflective celebration of that life was held at Burrombuttock on Saturday 3 February, attended by family and friends. We give thanks at All Saints' for the time that Nick and Anne shared with us in the Parish and in our local community before their move to Wodonga. We share their legacy in the gardens we enjoy and the learning that we shared with them through studies, discussion and *Life Long Learners*. Our loving thoughts are with his extended family as they mourn his death. In words included in the celebration of Nick's life the following gives us a glimpse of the foundation of his life journey:

"Service is the rent we pay for our room on earth"

#### WHO FUNDS YOUR CHURCH?

t is assumed by some in the community that churches, like Schools and even Private Schools (some Religious), are funded by Governments. Whilst some Government Grants are available to our Church these are rare and usually for specific purposes, and require detailed competitive application. The Parish is very much dependent on funds received from members of the parish who tithe (i.e. commit to regular financial support of the church's ministry).

During the 2023 year the Parish received Offertories by Direct Deposit of \$31,149.00 from 16 families, whilst Weekly Giving Envelopes totalled \$33,891.55 from 29 users. Loose collections were \$14,321.40. This giving is a necessary and very welcome commitment from around 90 parishioners and the occasional visitor. A total of \$79,361.95 from approximately 90 faithful servants. Let that sink in!

Of course, there are many of that same 90 who assist in reducing our operational costs by filling rosters, doing all number of various roles in a volunteer capacity around the Church and our properties, along with boosts to our funds by working at NEW2U, with the Catering Group, and with fundraising activities. In 2023 we received \$11,000.00 from NEW2U, \$6,000.00 from the Catering Group and \$4,438.20 from other fundraising. There are also local businesses that offer their skills & supplies at a discount or at no charge and other community members that just like to help out where they can.

In the past 5 years we have claimed the sum of \$285,371.84 from our limited Property Trust funds to upgrade our Parish Hall, Community Hub building and Tweedie Cottage all of which give us a regular income from rent and/or hire. In 2023 this income was \$39,465.28. The Property Trust funds are the invested funds from the sale of our Glebe Property at Gocup, are held by the Diocesan Property Trust and are only available for construction or upgrade of our properties (not everyday ministry support). Currently there is approximately \$80,000.00 remaining in this Fund.

The Parish Council's Proposed Budget for 2024 estimates overall Income to be \$158,360.00. This must cover costs to engage a full-time Minister and provide associated costs of Superannuation, Annual Leave, Ministry Allowance, Long Service Leave contributions, Housing & Utilities, Parish Car with registration, insurance, services, maintenance and operating expenses, and Clergy Conference expenses. All of which the Parish is obliged to meet along with the Parish Contribution to the Diocese, Insurances, Electricity, Rates and Water, Telephone, Repairs and Maintenance, and necessary Church supplies etc. The Parish also employs a part-time Office Assistant.

Budgeted expenditure for 2024 is \$199,977.00, foreshadowing a Deficit of \$41,617.00.

Our Church cannot survive with a deficit of this amount.

Going forward, how can we fund our Church and its ministry?

This is a matter for much prayer, discussion and renewed commitment by each and everyone of us as we strive to share the love and saving grace of Christ in our local community.

#### *MAINLY MUSIC*

It is exciting to see *mainly music* underway again after their recent summer break. The participants are excited by the programme and the opportunity it provides for sharing and fellowship. The helpers can feel young again as they play around on the floor with the children, sing the songs, listen to the stories and share the mainly music morning teas! There is an opportunity for any and every member of the Parish to make a





contribution to the success of the activity and to know

that they are part of our outreach to the community in Jesus' name. For some participants, this is their first serious experience of the love of Christ in action and it can have a profound effect on their lives. What a privilege to be part of that offering of ministry and to be able to pray for it.

Carol and Rev have now left for their stay in Katherine confident in the ability of Rev David and Rachel and the team to continue the ministry in their absence. If you wish to observe or be part of it, please contact Rev David.

#### PARISH AGM

Just as this issue goes to print the Parish has held its Annual General Meeting. This provided opportunities for reports to be made on all aspects of Parish activities, for Rev David to introduce himself to us and share some of the elements of his hopes and vision for the Parish as he comes amongst us, for those present to share ideas on future directions and needs and dreams, and for the realities of Parish financial matters to be addressed. Our Treasurer, Di Smith, has prepared an article (see p.5) to encourage us to face these realities and to consider our faithful and prayerful response to the challenges presented.

Following the AGM the new Parish Council for 2024 (elected last December) and the Wardens for 2024 take their places as leaders of our faith community. We are asked to pray continually and purposefully for them as they shoulder the responsibilities of their offices. They operate as our elected representatives and depend upon our support and encouragement to fulfil their roles effectively. Please pray for them, encourage them and deliberate upon the matters they deal with on our behalf.

#### ALL SAINTS' SUPPORTS BCA (Bush Church Aid)

Members of All Saints' Parish have for many years financially supported the work of Bush Church Aid in their ministry undertakings throughout Australia by participating in BCA's "money box scheme". This support



continues even now with many people using their money box to donate considerable amounts of "loose change" to the organisation. We pray that this faithful support will continue into the future, with regular box openings occurring in March and September each year. Times are a-changing and BCA also wishes to make their supporters aware of the alternative methods of support which may prove easier or more practical for you. This is what BCA writes:

"One way we (BCA) can make it easier is to assist you in moving to electronic giving. We recognise that people are carrying and using less cash these days. The Reserve Bank of Australia's Consumer Payment Survey showed in the past three years the percentage of Australians paying with cash has halved from more than 27 percent of total payments to just 13 percent. We want to encourage more people to give to BCA electronically. It is completely secure and straightforward to set up.

Option 1: BCA's Distance Giving Program allows you to set up a regular and secure credit card payment. To set this up head to our website (www.bushchurchaid.com.au/donate)

Option 2: Most banks will allow you to set up a regular deposit to another account. BCA's account details are: BSB 032 008 and Account Number 000706. Please ensure you use your 7-digit Supporter Number as a reference when making a direct deposit."

#### HISTORY RECORDED

These two photographs were commissioned by architect John Graham, of John Graham and Associates, following completion of conservation work on the church in the mid-1980s. The roof was jacked up, broken beams strengthened with steel, the walls pulled in and the roof lowered back into place.



Following Edmund Blacket's original plans John suggested re-covering the roof with slate (previously asbestos tiles). This was accomplished through a successful fund-raising campaign (a dollar a slate and dozens and dozens of lamingtons). The church was rededicated on 15 November 1986 by the Rt Rev Owen Dowling, Bishop of Canberra and Goulburn.

John Graham died in November 2022. The two framed photographs by an unknown photographer had hung in his office for many years. They were donated to the Parish on 8 November 2023 by Deirdre Hyslop, his life partner, in loving memory. They now hang in the Rectory.

#### **NEWS FROM NEW2U**

In 2023 the shop completed a most successful year of trading, successfully supporting Parish and community ministries. Financial support of \$11000 was provided to the Parish and \$2000 to the Tumut High School Chaplaincy Fund, leaving carry-over funds sufficient to underwrite trading in 2024.

Operating costs increased considerably in the latter half of 2023. A pledge has been made to the Parish budget for 2024 of \$8000 with the intention still of supporting the THS Chaplaincy Fund. As at the beginning of February \$1000 was donated to the latter to kick-start their 2024 budget.

There has been an explosion in donated goods over the last couple of months - for which donations we are always thankful. Due to the limited storage and display space available we have not been able to accept donations for a few weeks in February as we prepare for the summer/winter changeover in the shop. Some 'sales' will be held before Easter, easing the pressure of stock somewhat.

Thankyou to our volunteers who keep our service so alive and effective. We look forward to a great 2024.




